# **Tenders for Water Line and Water Treatment Plant Upgrades**

BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with the resolution to hire WSP, the low bid from LCL Construction Ltd. for the Water Treatment Plant Upgrades in the amount of \$390,339.00 plus applicable taxes be accepted whereby costs shall be shared on a 50/50 basis in accordance with the funding agreement with The Water Services Board. CARRIED.

# <u>Drainage – 219 and 213 Commercial Street</u>

1271 WHEREAS a verbal request was made by property owners at 219 and 213
Commercial Street to allow trenching between the properties to drain excess water into the municipal right-of-way through a culvert on Commercial Street and west to the municipal right-of-way on Fourth Street to allow the excess to flow north;

AND WHEREAS after review by Members of Council and the property owners, Members of Council supported the request;

AND WHEREAS in accordance with Drainage By-law No. 41-2024, a permit should have been completed and submitted to the Development Officer for review;

AND WHEREAS such review must take into consideration the impacts of the proposed works, the nature of the surrounding area, and any other factors the Officer considers relevant;

AND WHEREAS the Development Officer may issue a permit if, in the Officer's opinion, the drainage works will not adversely affect private property or municipal roads, drains and drainage and other municipal infrastructure and any impacts can be prevented, managed or remediated;

AND WHEREAS the Development Officer can take remediation action where necessary;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the property owners be requested to submit the required permit and deposits, and any remediation work be undertaken to the satisfaction of the Public Works Manager and Development Officer to ensure no adverse effects for property owners located on the north side of Commercial Street. CARRIED.
